"St Anna's recognises the importance of social engagement and the importance of close relationships for the health and wellbeing of our residents."

Who is a partner in care?

A partner in care is a person identified by the resident who they have a close and continuing relationship with, such as a family member or close friend. A partner regularly visits and provides care and companionship to the resident.

Partners in care may provide support such as:

- Helping with hygiene needs
- Helping to exercise
- · Helping to support lifestyle interests
- Helping at mealtimes

The type of care provided will depend on the needs of the resident and the relationship with their chosen partner. A partner in care is not a casual visitor, a visitor not providing an aspect of care, or a visitor who the resident does not want to have assisting with their care.

Learnings which you may need to undertake:

- Fire and emergency training
- Manual handling (as required)
- Altered swallowing
- Understanding Covid Aged Care
- PPE donning and doffing
